Pilots blame bosses for KQ financial woes

Doubted management's ability to turn around airline





Kenya Airways pilots have accused the management of the national car-rier of systemic blunders and haphazard decisions and questioned its ability to turn around the troubled

The pilots, under the Kenya Airline Pilots Association (Kalpa), accused the board and management of leasing its fleet at exorbitant prices.

They said the two have also turned a deaf ear on staff and customer grievances as they hire expensive expatriates to turn around the airline's dwindling fortunes.

The revelations emerged during a meeting of Kalpa officials and the Senate's Trade, Industrialization and Tourism Committee probing the op-

rations at KQ.

The probe follows a petition by Nandi Senator Samson Cherargei to inquire into KQ's operations in the wake of sustained huge losses posted by the national carrier.

Making a presentation before the panel chaired by Kajiado Senator Kanar Seki, Kalpa executive member Mwenda Mabura claimed that KQ is hiring planes at almost twice the market rate.

"Other lines lease a standard dreamliner at between \$425,000 and \$600,000 but here, we are leasing at a million dollars," Mabura said.
"Leases are not properly regulated.

We cannot have years and years of leasing an aircraft. When they reach a certain stage, they should be converted into cargo planes."

He said the management has developed a tendency of hiring old planes, some as old as 10 or 15 years but are paying the amount in leasing them despite depreciation.

Mabura also accused the management of opting to lease from three different companies, a move that has proved costly to the airline.

According to Kalpa, KQ management should reorganise its fleet to one manufacturer, preferably Boeing or General Electronics which have been in practice for many years.

"This will reduce lease rates, cost of spares, transitional and training costs and time and certification nightmares across various platforms," he said.

Currently, KQ fleet consists of a mix of owned and leased planes, including wide-body jets like the Boeing 787, narrow-body jets such as the Boeing 737 freighters.

Mabura said the management has proved incompetent and insensitive to the airline, staff and customers.

"Going by the delays, disruption of flights and direct lack of goodwill, I can say the board is incompetent," Mabura said. He was responding to a question by Uasin Gishu Senator Jackson Mandago who had sought his opinion on the competency of the management.

In the proposed law sponsored by Nandi Senator Samson Cherargel, at least two-thirds of members of a county assembly will be required to vote in favour of an impeachment motion to remove a CEC.

"Cognizant that the office of county executive committee member is established by the Constitution and noting the adverse consequences of removal by impeachment of

a member of a county executive committee, the threshold for voting for such a removal in the Act are

for such a removal in the Act are low," the Bill states.

The Bill has been introduced in the Senate for the first reading.

Currently, a CEC can be removed by a simple majority, at least more than half of the members of the county assembly.

CECs, who are equivalents of CSs in the national government, head various dockets in the county executive charged with discharging of devolved functions as set out in the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution. Several CECs have suffered impeachment by MCAs. However, the ward reps have been accused of executing the removal motions on filmsy grounds, sometimes political, owing to low threshold.
