QUESTION 1

Many managers are often caught up in a "Catch 22" situation because of the "management dilemma" they must face. While discharging their duties, a lot of consideration must be put into the consequences of their choices as well as the careful thought given to selection of alternatives available simply because several situations present themselves as "mutually exclusive". This therefore means that a prudent manager must be well trained and must possess the requisite skills that display his prowess, capabilities and competence that ultimately enable the organization achieve its objective. - i. Determine the two major objectives of operations management (4 marks)

- iii. What conclusion can be made after interpretation of a "false positive" (2 marks)
- iv. Explain the steps required for application of ISO 9000 (5 marks)
- v. When making a choice between the various inventory control techniques available, demonstrate your understanding of the following:

 - b. SDE
 - c. GOLF (6 marks)
- vi. Identify five soft skills and explain each of their application in management (5 marks)

QUESTION 2

i. More women are being appointed to top positions through affirmative action. Men perceive this as putting them in a vulnerable position and giving them a feeling of insecurity and a sense of competition. The position of CEO (Chief Executive Officer) of a leading manufacturing company has fallen vacant and the advertisement has attracted both men and women from the corporate sector who feel suitably qualified to fill the

vacancy. You have been appointed to lead a panel of experts to interview candidates for this position and you are aware that there are subtle differences that exist in management and leadership styles exhibited by both male and female managers separately which emanate from this variance in gender. Give reasons why you would:
